What Will I Study?

You will learn to manage various canine emergencies. Key topics include:

- ? The objectives of first aid and how to manage canine behaviour in emergency situations.
- ? Conducting a DR ABC (primary survey), including how to take a dog's temperature, pulse, and respiration rate.
- ? Examining an injured animal and taking action to manage shock.
- ? Practical skills: applying bandages and conducting CPR on a mannequin.
- ? Identifying different types of wounds and fractures and applying appropriate first aid.
- ? Managing and treating choking, stings, poisoning, hyperthermia, hypothermia, water inhalation, convulsions, gastric torsion, burns, and electrocution.
- ? Assembling a canine emergency first aid kit and communicating effectively during emergencies.

You will benefit from face-to-face teaching that contains a large amount of practical, hands-on learning alongside theoretical delivery. You will have the opportunity to practice your skills using models, mannequins, and live dogs wherever possible to build real-world confidence.
